Ask Questions. Your landlord should provide you with essential information but don't be shy to ask more questions to clarify things.

WASTE: Stash your trash.

Store your garbage in a container with a tight-fitting lid to deter critters from rooting through and making a mess.

Chat with your landlord to find out when garbage collection takes place and if there are any restrictions enforced.

Don't forget to retrieve your bin and keep it stored neatly.

NOISE: Please consider your neighbours.

When walking through your neighbourhood, be aware that noise can travel, especially at night.

If you're planning to throw an event or weekend party, consider the safety of your guests and the comfort of your neighbours. Not everyone in the neighbourhood is a night owl, so be considerate of your music levels and the noise your event is creating.

It's always good to chat with your neighbours to give them a heads-up. Exchanging contact information, giving plenty of notice and asking about any upfront concerns will clear up any issues so that everyone can enjoy their evening.

After a party or event, take a walk around your yard and clean up any bottles, cans or garbage to keep your neighbourhood in good shape.

Pay attention to the way your yard looks.


Keep your yard looking sharp. Taking care of your home involves removing any unwanted waste and garbage from the
