Whereas for many years P-Patch residents have had concerns about traffic congestion at Pine Street and Pleasant Drive; and

Whereas an Environmental Assessment in 2015/2016 studied the issue and recommended the opening of an unopened road allowance running between Northern Avenue, through Panoramic Drive to Princeton Avenue; and

Whereas the project has been in the 5-year capital plan since 2017 and the road is slated to be opened in 2021; and

8.2 OHIP Eye Care

Moved by: Councillor M. Scott

Seconded by: Councillor S. Hollingsworth

Whereas routine eye care is critical in early detection of eye diseases like glaucoma, cataracts, and macular degeneration, and the health of eyes is critical to overall health and quality of life; and

Whereas conditions that may be detected with an annual eye exam include: diabetes mellitus, glaucoma, cataracts, retinal disease, amblyopia (lazy eye), visual field defects (loss of part of the usual field of vision), corneal disease, strabismus (crosses eyes), recurrent uveitis (an inflammation of the uvea, the middle layer of the eye that consists of the iris, ciliary body and choroid), and optic pathway disease; and

Whereas payments from OHIP have only increased 9% over the last 30 years, which has not come close to matching inflation of costs, which include rent, staff, utilities, equipment, taxes and supplies; and

Whereas the lack of funding makes it difficult to invest in modern technology, and newer technology means earlier detection of eye disease; and

Whereas the Provincial government's refusal to formally negotiate with optometrists for more than 30 years has forced optometrists to absorb approximately \$173 million annually in the cost to deliver eye care to Ontarians; and

Whereas the 2021 Ontario budget did not address OHIP-insured eye care, Ontario optometrists took action and voted to withdraw OHIP services starting September 1, 2021, unless the government agrees to legally-binding negotiations to fund these services at least to the cost of delivery; and

Whereas this job action will jeopardize good eye-care for those who need the care of an optometrist the most and will have the greatest impact on the most vulnerable groups: children, whose lifetime ability to learn and develop depends on good vision and the elderly, who are at the greatest risk for vision threatening ocular diseases;

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that Council of the City of Sault Ste. Marie requests that the Provincial government recognize the value that access to quality eye care brings to all Ontarians and act now to protect it; further that the Provincial government address OHIP-insured eye care immediately and enter into legally-binding negotiations with Ontario optometrists to fund these services at least to the cost of delivery; and that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Premier Ford, Ontario Minister of Health Christine Elliott, and MPP Ross Romano.

8.3 Robinson-Huron Treaty

Whereas the Robinson-Huron Treaty recognizes the political and economic relationship between the First Nations signatories and the Crown, including the sharing of revenues of any resource development on the lands involved in the treaty; and

Whereas the Ontario Superior Court found the Crown has a mandatory and reviewable obligation to increase the Treaties' annuities when the economic circumstances warrant, reflecting a fair share of the value of the net Crown resource-based revenues, generated from the territory; and

Whereas, the Court also found that the First Nation plaintiffs' claims are not barred by Ontario's limitations legislation and that the Government of Ontario does not benefit from the doctrine of Crown immunity; and

Whereas Ontario appealed these decisions, but the appeals have not yet been decided; and

Whereas Canada did not appeal the decisions; and

Whereas on August 13, 2021, the Robinson-Huron Treaty Leadership received correspondence from Crown-Indigenous Relations Minister, Carolyn Bennett, informing them that Canada was prepared to enter into negotiations and settle their ongoing annuities litigation out of court; and

Whereas Canada's mandate to resolve this claim comes with the requirement that the Province of Ontario be party to the negotiations and settlement; and

Whereas a settlement of this claim will not only assist the Robinson-Huron Treaty Nations achieve improved health outcomes and economic development, as well as assist all of northeastern Ontario:

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that, Mayor Provenzano, on behalf of City Council, write a letter to Premier Doug Ford encouraging the Provincial Government to enter into good faith negotiations with the Robinson-Huron Leadership to finally settle this dispute.
