The Courthouse, with its four imposing columns above the entrance, is a fine example of Beaux-Arts Classicism. It was completed in 1922 to the design of Frank R. Heakes, Chief Architect of the Ontario Department of Works.

The two hangars were built in 1924-1925 and 1947 to serve as maintenance locations for the bush planes of the Ontario Provincial Air Service.

Methods of suppressing forest fires were developed and tested here. The 1947 hangar is now the home of the Canadian Bushplane Heritage Centre.

The Forest Insect Laboratory is of heritage value because of its association with important government research activities between 1945 and 1966. It is one of the few remaining examples of Art Moderne architecture in Sault Ste. Marie.

Memorial Tower

The Memorial Tower commemorates those who died in the World and Korean Wars. With its streamlined form and its use of concrete and glass blocks, the Tower is an example of the Moderne style. The cupola on top is a reminder of the eternal flame that marks the grave of the Unknown Soldier.
