

- Getting around using human power (e.g. walking, cycling and various forms of wheeling and rolling, such as skateboarding and using scooters).
- Public transit and emerging electric scooters and bikes are not considered AT, however, they are still an integral part of the larger active transportation initiative.



What is an Active **Transportation Master Plan** (ATMP)?


- A long-term strategic plan.A roadmap to increase and enhance the AT network.

 Implementation and funding strategies.




What is an Active Transportation Master Plan (ATMP)? • It is not a construction plan – particularly relevant for the construction of physical infrastructure.
