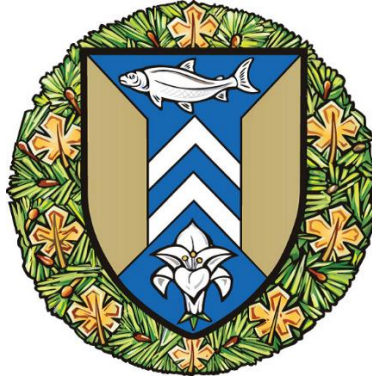

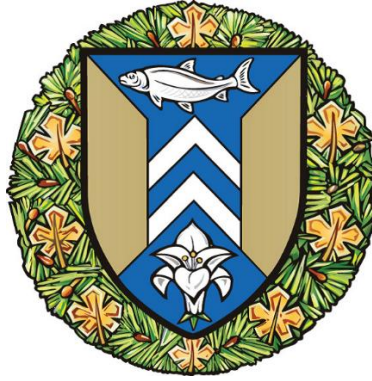

Downtown Civic Address Signs Funding Program

The City of Sault Ste. Marie's Accessibility Advisory Committee has identified Civic Address signs as an important way to improve accessibility in the downtown area, particularly for pedestrians with vision loss.

This voluntary program provides funding to eligible downtown businesses for the purchase and installation of Civic Address signs where no sign currently exists, or where an existing sign is not effective due to its location, size, style, or visibility.

Funding is available up to a maximum of \$500 per business and will be paid directly to the sign vendor selected by the business. If the total cost exceeds \$500, the business is responsible for the remaining balance. If the total cost is less than \$500, the City will only pay the actual amount. A total of \$5,000 is available for this program on a first-come, first-served basis.

Applications must include a draft sign design that follows the guidelines below, along with a quote from the selected sign vendor. Applications will be reviewed monthly, and applicants will be notified by email whether their Civic Address Sign has been approved.

1. Accessibility Principles

Civic Address signs should be consistent, predictable, and easy to locate.

2. Sign Material

The sign must be durable, weather proof and, installed to be resistant to vandalism and theft.

3. Sign Size

Preferred sign size is **11" x 17"**

Where space constraints exist, as large as possible with prior approval from the Accessibility Coordinator.

Where a sign is placed on a glass door, it may be **8.5" x 11"** and must have:

- A frosted background; and
- No patterned background

4. Font Size and Type

- Numbers must be as large as possible to fill the space appropriately
- Sans serif font must be used
- No patterned background

5. Colour Contrast

Signs must use either dark blue or black font on a white background, or white font on dark blue or black background. See attached samples for colour, font and sizes.

6. Sign Placement

Signs should be placed immediately beside the door on the latch side, where possible.

If that location is not possible, the sign should be placed in the most suitable location beside the door on the latch side.

If the sign is to be placed on a glass door, the background must be frosted and the preferred locations are:

- 1) Upper middle of the door
- 2) Upper latch side of the door
- 3) Above the handle on the latch side
